What is Cyberbullying?

Information for Parents

Many of our children and teens use computers in a variety of ways-- email, social networking, cell phones, on-line game devices and for school-related projects. It is important that adults have a good understanding of what cyber-bullying is. The National Association for School Psychologists defines Cyber-bullying as : an individual or group willfully using information and communication involving electronic technologies to facilitate deliberate and repeated harassment or threat to another individual or group by sending or positing cruel test and or graphics using technological means" (Mason, 2009, p. 323). Current estimates indicate that 20% to 35% of children and adolescents experience cyber-bullying (Diamandurons, Downs & Jenkins, 2008; Kowalski & Limber, 2007).

It is my hope that through this article, parents become more aware of cyber-bullying and that they play an important role in monitoring their child's use of electronic communications. Steps that can be taken by parents to reduce cyber-bulling include: Providing supportive communication between family members Parental monitoring of what sites your child accesses Limiting the personal information your child provides to others Creating family rules about electronic communication Using software programs to restrict access to specific sites Reducing time spent online without parental supervision

These general guidelines may be helpful to your family and may be helpful in facilitating discussions about internet safety and cyber-bullying with your children. Most importantly, let your children know that they can discuss cyber-bullying and with you at anytime and will be an advocate for them.
